I just held the first exhibit of the second series of my Survivors Finding Voice project about sexual abuse. This series has 11 new survivor stories and was hosted by the library at Piedmont Technical College in Greenwood, SC. I had the opportunity to speak about the project and the stories to a group of students and community folks. After the program was over, I came around the exhibit and saw a very shy, very young woman taking photographs of the panels. I spoke to her and she said, "I am O and I am working with S (a counselor) at Beyond Abuse (the local advocacy center). I study photography here." Her voice was a whisper that told me that she was very early in recovery. I asked her if she had heard me speak and she replied that she had. I said, "Remember that all of these survivors did a lot of work and they have lives and jobs and families and friends and joy." She looked deeply into my eyes with her eyes holding pain and doubt as she said, "I hope I will." She asked if we could have a photo made together and we did. She collected all my handouts and clung to my arm like a life line. If she had been the only person there at the exhibit or at the talk it would have been more than enough.

About Spiritual Direction -


- Offers a space and time for you to explore, reflect upon, and deepen your relationship with God.
